- Is it a matter of interior belief or external actions?


-

- What are our blindspots?

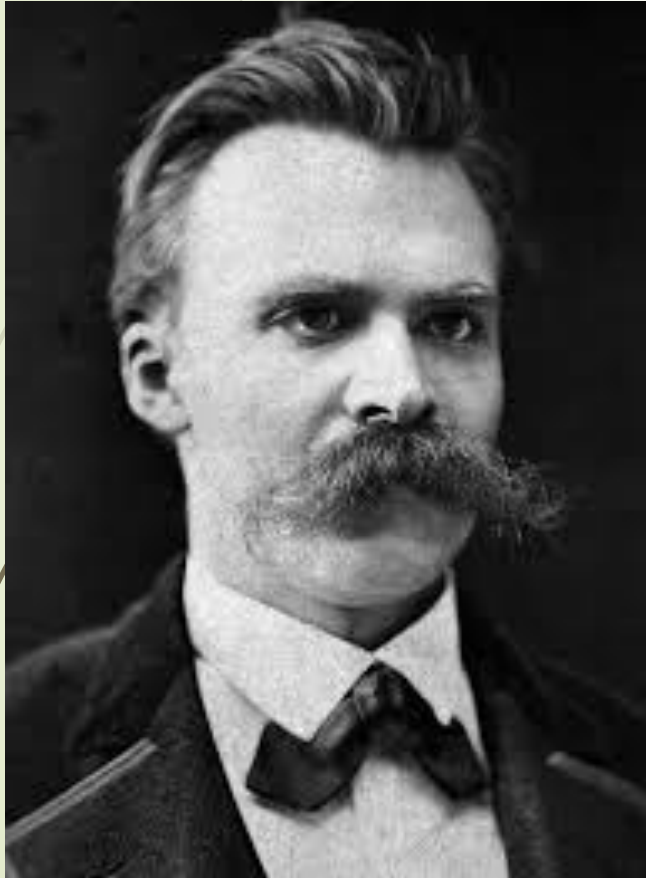


Our Community
